### NEW STUDENT PROFILE FALL 2009 (as of Drop/Add)

#### Freshmen (First Time in College/FTIC – USF System)

- USF enrolled 4,401 freshmen: 3,168 in fall and 1,233 in summer
- Tampa: 3,895, St. Petersburg: 506
- Fall average GPA: 3.80, average SAT: 1185, mid-range SAT: 1090-1270
- 50% graduated within the top 20% of their high school class
- 93% Florida resident freshmen are Bright Futures scholarship recipients
- 38% are non-White
- 4,197 freshmen are from Florida, 204 are non-Florida residents
- Fall freshmen come from 53 Florida counties, 40 U.S. states, 59 countries and 416 Florida high schools
- 64% reside in on-campus housing
- 23 are National Merit, 2 are National Achievement and 8 are National Hispanic Scholars

#### Transfer

- USF enrolled 4,926 new transfer students
- 3,138 transfer students come from 29 Florida community colleges
- 228 are from Florida public 4-year institutions
- 179 are from institutions outside of Florida
- Highest number of transfers are from Hillsborough Community College
- 30% are non-White

#### Honors College

- 504 freshmen enrolled, and 2,000 total students enrolled
- 35 new students enrolled in the Research Scholar Program (minimum 1350 SAT required)
- 100 new FTIC students enrolled in the BA/MD program
- Average GPA: 4.20, Average SAT score: 1356

#### Graduate

- 2,556 new graduate students enrolled, including 1,993 master's students, 443 doctoral students and 120 MD students.
- 33% are non-White

### DID YOU KNOW?

- USF is one of only three Florida public universities classified by the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching in the top tier of research universities (RU/VH), a distinction attained by only 2.2 percent of all universities. USF is also one of only 25 public research universities nationwide that holds both RU/VH and Engaged designations by the Carnegie Foundation.
- USF is ranked 44th in total research expenditures for public universities by the National Science Foundation.
- With a 213 percent increase between 2000 and 2007, no other American university grew its federal research enterprise at a faster rate than USF according to the *Chronicle of Higher Education*.
- USF is the first campus in the nation to strike an accord with the Department of Veterans Affairs to have specialized academic guidance services for veterans taking advantage of the Post-9/11 Veterans Education Bill.
- USF's Pediatric Epidemiology Center has received \$300 million in National Institutes of Health funding to direct global efforts in juvenile diabetes research.
- More than \$8 million has been invested over the last two years in USF Health core research facilities to support innovative technologies that enhance interdisciplinary research and collaboration.
- The graduate program in entrepreneurship has been ranked the fifth best in the nation.
- USF competes with NCAA Division I Conference rivals in 17 varsity sports. The men's soccer team earned the 2008 Big East championship title, men's tennis earned the 2009 Big East title and women's basketball the 2009 WNIT championship.
- The Bulls excel in the classroom, with 159 USF student-athletes named to the 2008-09 Big East All-Academic Team.
- USF has 224,000 alumni representing all 50 states and 124 nations.
- USF is the first university in Florida and the first major public research university in the Southeast to establish a Confucius Institute.
- Part of the Florida Energy Systems Consortium, USF's Clean Energy Research Center is a leader in photovoltaic technologies and solar thermal technologies.
