

NEW TRUCKS!

The USF waste management and recycling program recently completed a significant upgrade by trading in four aging trucks for two newer and more efficient models.

This transition marks the culmination of two years of preparation and dedicated effort, involving close collaboration between the truck operators, the Vehicle Maintenance team, and OAS leadership.

Instead of four larger trucks, the team now operates with two smaller, more maneuverable trucks, along with backup vehicles. The new trucks are better suited for navigating University roads and accessing buildings with limited access points, in addition to offering improved safety and visibility for drivers.

Research revealed that the 25-yard trucks were not being filled to capacity, meaning that drivers were making unnecessary trips to waste disposal facilities. By upgrading to new trucks, Vehicle Maintenance aims to maintain service availability while optimizing efficiency.

Recycling Truck Operator, José Tirado, advocated for the replacement of the retired trucks, citing their increasing inefficiency and costly maintenance due to frequent breakdowns. He is enthusiastic about the new trucks and believes they will greatly benefit his team and the university's waste management operations.

On February 5th, the University of South Florida held its annual Campus Safety Day, a collaborative effort between the USF Police Department and the Department of Emergency Management. The event aimed to equip members of the USF community with essential safety skills, disaster preparedness knowledge, and crime prevention strategies.

With over 30 participating groups, including key campus safety entities like the USF Police Department, Emergency Management, and Environmental Health and Safety, the event provided a comprehensive overview of available resources to ensure the safety of the USF community. Attendees engaged in hands-on activities such as fire extinguisher training and witnessed a detection K9 demonstration by the USF Police Department K9 unit featuring K9 Alma and K9 Toro.

In addition to interactive sessions, Campus Safety Day offered educational opportunities on various safety topics through informational booths and presentations. Attendees had the chance to learn about crime prevention techniques, fire safety protocols, and disaster preparedness essentials.
