

John is the recipient of the "Individual Artist Award" by the Arts Council of Hillsborough County. La Lucha was awarded Creative Loafing's "Best of the Bay Jazz Ensemble" in 2013, 2014 & 2015. John has toured nationally and internationally including

performances at Umbria Jazz Festival and Jazz à Juan. John is a Yamaha Artist.

In addition to his award-winning musical career, John attained a PhD in Neuroscience at the University of South Florida College of Medicine and was a recipient of the Ruth L. Kirschstein fellowship from the National Institute of Neurological Disease and Stroke.

He holds a B.S. in Business Logistics from Penn State University, as well as an M.A. in Geography and a Ph.D. in Marine Science (Geology), both from USF. He has professional experience in land use planning, and has lived in the Tampa Bay region since 1986.

He has co-authored a book (with A.C. Hine, D.P. Chambers, T.D. Clayton, and G.T. Mitchum), Sea Level Rise in Florida: Science, Impacts and Options (2016, University Press of Florida), and actively serves as a member of theTampa Bay Climate Science Advisory Panel, the Florida Water and Climate Alliance, and the USF Center for Brownfields Research and Redevelopment.
