Classics Concentration

Classics is an interdisciplinary humanities field. We provide instruction in the Greek and Latin languages and in Greek and Roman civilization, literature, mythology and religion. Faculty offer courses in diverse aspects of the Greek and Roman world and mentor students in the acquisition of specific applied skills through their studies. This concentration is of special interest to students who wish to teach Greek and/or Latin at the pre-college level, and to those who plan for graduate study in a humanistic discipline, including law and medicine.
