# **Interdisciplinary Classical Civilizations Concentration**

This concentration is of special interest to students who wish to study broadly the literature, history art, and archaeology, philosophy, and religion of Greece, Rome and the Near East, equally emphasizing language and translation courses. It allows students with an interest in the Classical World (i.e., Greco-Roman tradition) to pursue a curriculum of study that encompasses an interdisciplinary approach. Many of our students choose this concentration because they have an interest in studying the classical tradition beyond the bounds of one department, and they are able to take the classes that will prepare them for graduate studies and/or a career upon graduation.
