Russian Concentration

This concentration seeks to prepare its students to understand the language, literature, and culture of Russia. One of its primary goals is to prepare students to be able to interact productively with Russian speakers. The concentration seeks to develop the highest possible level of proficiency in the Russian language in each of its students as a foundation for both academic understanding and everyday communication. In order to achieve this goal, the Russian concentration treats language and culture as an inextricably bound up nexus that has to be inculcated at every step of the learning process.
