ISLAC ABROAD Meeting of Migration Specialists at the University of Chile

On November 16th, 2022, the Chair of Cátedra on Racism and Contemporary Migrations at the University of Chile, Dr. Ximena Poo, held a meeting with some academics including Dr. Beatriz Padilla (ISLAC Director), who is the cochair of the International Migration Section of the Latin American Studies Association (LASA). The meeting took place at the University of Chile's Casa Central and aimed at reflecting on the context and flow of migrations in the continent. Ximena Póo, said the meeting contributed to an interdisciplinary dialogue "to know more about experiences of research, action and solidarity in academic spaces across the Americas, and explore the possibilities for future common initiatives with Dr Padilla".

Dr Padilla added that "in addition to explore future collaborations, it is important to assess the impact that our research can have on policy-making in the Latin American space". Those who attended the meeting expressed hope for more discussions on how to change the stigma regarding migrants and migration.



Faculty Spotlight Dr. Madeline Cámara Publications and Future Projects at USF



Madeline Cámara Betancourt, Professor of Latin American literature at the World Languages Department, is a leading scholar in the field of Cuban Studies. She has published various books and editions: Cuban Women Writers: Imagining a Matria (NY: Palgrave, 2008), La memoria hechizada (Barcelona: Icaria, 2002) Cuba: The Ellusive Nation (University of Gainesville, Florida, 2000) and Cuentos Cubanos Contemporáneos (Xalapa: Editorial Veracruzana, 1997) besides numerous articles and essays in national and international journals.

Her recent research focuses on the Spanish philosopher María Zambrano, about whom she has published two anthologies: María Zambrano: Words for the World (2011) and María Zambrano, between the Caribbean and the Mediterranean (2015). A monographic about Zambrano's legacy in Latin America is her upcoming publication in the Transatlantic Studies Network, a journal of the University of Málaga (UMA). With this institution, she has developed collaborations under the umbrella of "Aula María Zambrano", which brings together the efforts of UMA and USF scholars who are devoted to Zambrano's studies as well as Transatlantic Studies. Presently, she is working with UMA and ISLAC to forge a series of lectures and publications involving our students.

Cámara is interested in bridging teaching and research, thus her work in progress entitled "Contigo, Gloria Anzaldúa," is a hybrid essay that includes notes from classes, students' opinions, research, and personal experiences.

In addition, Dr Cámara continues her work as editor and literary critic, a passion from her youth in Cuba, and contributes to Classic Subversive, a literary magazine published in Tampa, that disseminates the work of Hispanic writers and artists from our local community. Students and professors are invited to publish under the section "Seminole/USF Mailbox."

PHC 4116: Public Health in Panama

This course is open to all undergraduate students. This course will allow students to compare health systems in Panama to those in the United States. Some topics discussed will include infectious diseases, environmental health, and emergency management. Students will also gain a unique cultural perspective while visiting this beautiful country during the summer.

Students will visit Panama for ten days. This program, from June 9-19 2023, will allow you to visit multiple cities throughout Panama including Panama City, Embara, the Panama Canal and Monkey Island. Students will study a variety of public health issues and the cultural context in which they occur. Cultural immersion and field visits will provide students with an understanding of various factors that affect health outcomes in Panamanian society. We will also have an opportunity to participate in community service. This program will have a service learning component to it.
