The subrecipient (VI DPNR) agrees to serve as a co-principal investigator and support the research conducted for the project entitled "Developing an operational Sargassum HAB monitoring and forecasting system for the southeastern US and US Caribbean waters," funded under NOAA award no. NA23NOS4780291 to the lead institution (USF). The subrecipient agrees to assist the lead institution, with administrative support, field research and data analysis to collect and georeferenced UAV-based images of nearshore sargassum patches, and outreach activities to foster linkages to management in the USVI through performance of the scope of work outlined below, which may be modified as agreed upon by the subrecipient and the lead institution.

The purpose of the "Developing and operational and Sargassum HAB monitoring and forecasting system for the southeastern US and US Caribbean waters" project is to effectuate Sargassum Harmful Algal Bloom (Sargassum HAB) mitigation through (1) improving existing Sargassum detection and forecasting technologies, (2) better understanding of the associated impacts of Sargassum HAB inundation and beaching, (3) autonomous delivery of timely, accurate information on current conditions and forecasts, and (4) engagement and collaboration with end-users to ensure transition of the project outputs to management action. The focus of the project will be to develop an improved system to track and map daily sargassum distribution at coarse to fine spatial resolutions in the southeastern US and US Caribbean, autonomously integrated across multiple distribution platforms, and to engage end-users of the mapping and tracking products to ensure incorporation into routine sargassum monitoring and mitigation.

VI DPNR will support the research under this project through: Administrative support; field research to collect in situ sargassum distribution and biomass data; and outreach and stakeholder engagement. Work associated with this SOW will be conducted between the 2024 and 2028 calendar years.

Administrative Support:

DPNR will coordinate and manage all administrative work associated with data management and reporting within the US Virgin Islands (USVI). This includes assisting, planning, and attending

annual project management and Management Transition Advisory Group (MTAG) meetings, development and submission of all necessary permits for in situ data collection, administration and coordination of all VI DPNR staff engaged on research for this project, data management, coordination and dissemination to other research members of in situ collected environmental data and UAV-obtained imagery of sargassum and other field sampling and ground truth efforts for product development, and organize and manage outreach and stakeholder engagement with all relevant agencies and public groups within the USVI.

Field Research:

VI DPNR will conduct field sampling within the USVI in support of validation and quantification of Sargassum HAB impacts towards developing improved identification and forecasting capabilities. Specifically, VI DPNR will focus on fully characterizing the sub-pixel detection limit of Sargassum within a pixel, a specific AFAI value for the upper limit of Sargassum coverage within a pixel for the SuperDove sensors. VI DPNR will conduct annual field surveys to collect imagery of Sargassum patches as they move inshore using unmanned aerial vehicles (UAV) and gps collected ground control points to characterize size and distribution of Sargassum patches. Additionally, VI DPNR will collect in situ data to characterize water quality, and use transects and net collection of sargassum towards estimation of area occupied and sargassum biomass. All in situ data will be collected on paper datasheets and scanned and archived and transferred into Microsoft excel spreadsheets containing metadata related to the dataset. All photograph and video data will be stored as .JPEG, .MOV, or .MP4 formats. DPNR will coordinate along with Co-PI's Brewton and Morrell a consultation with the NCCOS Scientific Data Coordinator to determine data formatting and management requirements and will coordinate regularly with all members of the research team to ensure all data meets those requirements and to develop a data management, QA/QC, sharing and archiving plans for all data collected by VI DPNR.

Outreach and stakeholder engagement:

VI DPNR will further support efforts to disseminate and increase use of SHAPES through existing outreach and education programs, including the Reef Responsible program (@reefresponsiblevi; @Reef Responsible VI). These efforts, completed in collaboration with associated vendors, will focus on developing media and print documentation, including training materials to help public stakeholders use and understand the tools developed in the project, and providing technical guidance to other management agencies in how to use the tools provided to enhance *Sargassum* management and mitigation plans. VI DPNR staff will attend in-person meetings that bring together management agencies for the region (e.g., Caribbean Fisheries Management Council Meetings) to share information and outcomes from this project for use by management agencies in the region. VI DPNR staff will further coordinate dissemination and training of other divisions with the Government of the Virgin Islands that have management responsibilities related to *Sargassum* in the territory. Finally, VI DPNR will coordinate with all other entities conducting *Sargassum* research in the territory, as they are required to submit research permits through VI DPNR. In addition, the Director of VI DPNR – Division of Fish and Wildlife, Dr. Nicole Angeli will serve as the Chair for the MTAG.

Products

VI DPNR will provide USF, digital copies of all sampling protocols and data collected during field surveys. This will include scans of original data sheets, electronic spreadsheets, and digital image or video data associated with surveys. Additionally, copies of all outreach and education materials developed including training materials, infographics, and social media posts will be provided to USF and all project partners as developed. All materials and supplies and capital equipment purchased under this subaward will remain the property of VI DPNR.

This position relates to all program objectives. Sennai Habtes will provide 100 hours/year effort based on a 12-month appointment annual base salary = \$97,800 (\$47.02 hourly rate) for \$4,702/year in Y1-Y5 (total of \$23,510 in 5 years).

Fish Biologist III – TBD will coordinate all field sampling and research, and directly liaise with other agencies and stakeholders in the territory to develop management objects for product use in the territory. - (D) <u>Davis-Bacon Act</u>, as amended (40 U.S.C. 3141-3148). When required by Federal program legislation, all prime construction contracts in excess of \$2,000 awarded by non-Federal entities must include a provision for compliance with the Davis-Bacon Act (40 U.S.C. 3141-3144, and 3146-3148) as supplemented by Department of Labor regulations (29 CFR Part 5, "Labor Standards Provisions Applicable to Contracts Covering Federally Financed and Assisted Construction"). Each tier certifies to the tier above that it will not and has not used Federal appropriated funds to pay any person or organization for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a member of Congress, officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a member of Congress in connection with obtaining any Federal contract, grant or any other award covered by 31 U.S.C. 1352. Each tier must also disclose any lobbying with non-Federal funds that takes place in

connection with obtaining any Federal award. Such disclosures are forwarded from tier to tier up to the non-Federal award.
