The MWC hosts a biannual Meet the Employers networking event held specifically for employers seeking supply chain management talent for internships and full-time positions. Additionally, the Supply Chain Professionals student organization offers opportunities for growth and community beyond the classroom with executives, students, and alumni.


What sets the Muma College of Business apart?
