Bachelor of SOCIAL WORK

The University of South Florida offers a program leading to a **Bachelor of Social Work (BSW)** degree in the School of Social Work within the College of Behavioral and Community Sciences. The BSW program is fully accredited by the Council on Social Work Education, the national accrediting body for social work education programs.

The primary objective of the BSW program is the preparation of the graduate for beginning level practice as a social work generalist.

Students can expect to develop an understanding of the following:

- Dynamics of human behavior in individual, group, community, and organizational contexts
- Influences of the social cultural environment upon those behaviors
- Social welfare systems and institutions
- Social, economic, and political processes affecting policy development and program implementation
- Utilization of basic social work research skills.

The BSW program is intentionally broad to prepare students to care for a variety of populations that are at risk across different settings. It is an excellent option for students that want to help others and for students who are looking for variety and flexibility in their careers.

Admissions Criteria

To be admitted to the BSW at USF students should complete most, if not all, of the general education requirements, achieve junior status, and:

- Declare a major in social work in the USF College of Behavioral and Community Sciences at https://www.usf.edu/cbcs/undergraduate/ major-minor-declaration-change.aspx
- Complete all prerequisites and be in good academic standing
- Earn a minimum of a "C" grade in all prerequisites (no "C-" grades)
- Take SOW 3203, Introduction to Social Work course, and earn a minimum of a "B" grade in that course (no "B-" grades)

Admissions Process

- Apply to USF during any semester (fall, spring, or summer)
- Apply to the Tampa campus for the in-person social work cohort
- Apply to the Sarasota-Manatee campus for the online social work cohort

Social work major cohorts will begin their BSW coursework in either the spring or fall semesters. The major coursework will take four semesters to complete; however, there are no social work major courses offered during summer semesters. Summer semesters are reserved for students to complete any missing prerequisites, general education requirements, electives, or study abroad opportunities.

The BSW program is a full-time, lock-step structured program with two different modalities.

- The in-person cohort takes their coursework through the Tampa campus. Students will generally be on campus three days a week.
- The online cohort takes their coursework through the Sarasota– Manatee campus. It is a mixture of synchronous and asynchronous coursework. There will generally be two days a week in which students are expected to be online for live, virtual class sessions.

Both cohorts have a 460-hour field placement in their final semester of the program. Students will be placed in a social work agency for 32 hours per week which generally breaks down to Monday – Thursday, 8:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. Then they have classes on Fridays. There is currently no option to complete the BSW program in a part-time format.
