
Financial Aid Terms & Conditions

- What are they?
 - Requirements you must meet in order to remain eligible for financial aid
- Why do you need to know this?
 - Before grant and loan funds can be paid, you are <u>required</u> to **READ** and **ACCEPT** the Terms & Conditions in **Student Self-Service** <u>every year</u>

After accepting the terms and conditions, the 'Award Offer' tab will be active, allowing you to accept your student loans





Florida Bright Futures for Graduate Students









Bright Futures Scholarship

- If you were a Florida Academic Scholar or Florida Medallion Scholar recipient who graduated with a bachelor's degree in the 2023-24 academic year or later, in seven or fewer semesters, you may be eligible to receive Bright Futures funding for <u>ONE</u> semester of graduate study, <u>not to exceed 15 credit hours</u> paid at the undergraduate rate.
- We notify all students who appear to be eligible
- You must repay USF for any courses you drop that were paid with Bright Futures



Report Funds From Other Sources


- Financial aid (including loans) must be reduced if you receive more aid than the cost of attendance including:
 - Tuition Waivers
 - Scholarships
 - Stipends
 - Fellowships
- If you expect funds not listed on your award notice or in **Student Self-Service**, notify us immediately using the 'Additional Resources' tab in **Student Self-Service**

Graduate Federal Unsubsidized Direct Loans

- Maximum Ioan amount per term: \$10,250
- FAFSA required
- Satisfactory Academic Progress eligible
- Must have remaining loan eligibility-\$138,500 (Includes all Federal subsidized &/or unsubsidized loans borrowed)
- Interest rate: 8.083% (2024-2025 rates; changes every July 1)
- Origination fee: 1.057% (2024-2025 rates; changes every July 1)

Graduate Federal Unsubsidized Direct Loans

In order to receive your loan funds you must:

- 1. Accept your loans in Student Self-Service
- 2. Complete the (MPN) Master Promissory Note (if borrowing for the first time)
- 3. Entrance Counseling (if borrowing for the first time)
- 4. Be enrolled in at least 5 USF graduate credit hours

Note: Enrollment requirements for financial aid are the same year round even if your program or department considers one course as half-time or full-time



Direct Graduate PLUS Loan

You may apply for funds to cover up to the difference between your cost of attendance and other aid/resources

- Be enrolled in at least 5 USF graduate credit hours
- Apply at https://studentaid.gov
 - Credit based
 - Completed FAFSA required
 - SAP Eligible
 - Graduate PLUS loan MPN required
 - 9.083% Interest Rate (2024-2025 rates; changes every July 1)
 - Origination Fee 4.228% (2024-2025 rates; changes every July 1)

TUITION & FEE DEFERMENTS





Tuition Deferment



A tuition deferment prevents cancellation of registration for non-payment of fees, and temporarily prevents assessment of late payment fees

Term	Tuition Payment Due	Deferment Payment Date
Spring 2025	January 17, 2025	February 28, 2025

Tuition not paid by the deferment payment date will be assessed a late payment fee and have a cash collection hold placed on your student account by Student Accounting Services (SVC 1039) sfshelp@usf.edu



How Do I Receive a Tuition Deferment

Automatically posted in Student Self-Service under 'Home' if you:

 Have scholarships/fellowships (including Bright Futures) listed on your Student Self-Service account

OR:


- Have a FAFSA on file at USF 10 business days before classes begin; and
- Are enrolled in at least 5 graduate level USF credit hours; and
- Are meeting Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) requirements

Check Student Self-Service and your USF email each semester after registering for classes to see if you qualify!





Tuition Deferment







BOOKSTORE ADVANCE PURCHASE PROGRAM (BAPP)







BAPP

- Allows eligible students to purchase their textbooks & supplies prior to the first day of classes using financial aid before it is paid at the USF Bookstore
- The amount spent posts as a charge to the student account and is paid when financial aid is disbursed after the end of the first week of classes





How Do I Receive the BAPP?

To qualify, you must:

- Be degree seeking
- Be enrolled at least half-time (5 cr/hrs) in graduate level USF hours and
- Have financial aid that is at least \$100 more than the student account charges
 - Maximum amount \$500
- Last day to use: 1/17/2025

You will receive an email at your USF email if you qualify one day after you have registered for classes





Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP)

SAP is a Federal Requirement for Federal Aid Programs!

Your satisfactory academic progress status is <u>based on your entire</u> graduate level academic record regardless of whether you received financial aid

- Maintain a 3.0 USF GPA each semester
- Earn 67% of all attempted hours each semester

Monitor Your SAP Status Each Semester!


You must complete your degree within the following limits in order to continue receiving aid (includes prior graduate programs attended at USF, graduate credits taken at other schools and changes of graduate programs even if you did not receive financial aid):

- MA/MS—70 attempted hours
- EdS—115 attempted hours (includes hours at the MA/MS level)
- PhD/EdD—135 attempted hours (includes hours at the MA/MS &/or EdS levels)

How Your Bill Is Paid with Financial Aid

- When is tuition due?
 - At the end of the <u>fifth day of classes</u> each term for all students
- When will financial aid be paid?
 - Financial aid is paid on the <u>sixth day of classes</u> after enrollment is confirmed
 - Aid will be paid for classes taken on an alternate calendar six days after the start of classes
 - If all charges have been paid and a credit results, remaining funds will be e-Deposited to your personal bank account (if you subscribed via Student Self-Service)
- What happens if I do not pay on time?
 - Your enrollment will be <u>cancelled</u> unless you have a <u>tuition & fee deferment</u>
 - Reinstatement into classes after cancellation requires tuition and \$200 in late fees to be paid in full. Financial aid cannot be used to cover your reinstatement costs

Paying Your Bill On Your Own



- Can I Pay Using an Electronic Check (E-Check)?
 - May be used in Student Self-Service only
 - No additional charge
- Can I Pay Using a Credit Card?
 - May be used in Student Self-Service only (AmEx, Discover, MasterCard)
 - Convenience fee charge
- Can I Pay In Person?
 - Checks only in the drop box outside Student Accounting Services (SVC 1039)





Paying Your Bill On Your Own

Can I Mail A Payment?

- Checks or Money Orders only—Must be postmarked by the 5th day of the term
- Include your full name and USF ID number and mail the payment to the university lockbox:

- 3. Make sure your bill is paid by the deadline each semester if you do not have a financial aid tuition deferment
- 4. Most financial aid processes take 3-4 weeks to complete; plan accordingly!
