


# **KALTURA QUIZZES**

## **Creating Quizzes**

The Quiz function enhances the engagement of your videos by allowing you to embed knowledge-check questions that feed directly to the Canvas gradebook.




Begin by opening your video in My Kaltura and choose +Create (1), then Video Quiz (2).




From the **Editor/Media Selection** screen, find the video you wish to use and press the teal **Select** button to the right of it. Kaltura will create a backup of your video.



From the left panel, you can set your quiz parameters.





Details – This is basic information about the quiz including: Name (1), Welcome Message (2), Allow Downloading of Quiz Questions (3), and any Instructions (4) that will appear at entry.




**Scores** – This allows you to set up the number of attempts and score feedback.

**Experience** – This allows for answer changing, question skipping, and seeking.






Once you set all parameters you can begin adding questions. To do this, play your video and stop it at the point where you would like the question to prompt. You can also go directly to a spot within a video by clicking within the player at the bottom (1). In this case, the question is set to prompt at the 01:00.36 point within the video. Once you have set where you want the question to prompt, select Add a Question (2).




Choose a question type. Multiple Choice and True/False will be automatically scored and feed directly to your Canvas gradebook *when you add the video to an assignment*. Open-Ended and Reflection Points will appear within the Kaltura Analytics.

For this example, we will use a True/False question. Input your question and select **Save** (1). A marker appears on the timeline (2) where your question should appear. Continue adding questions.






Be sure to space your questions at sufficient lengths apart. If they are too close, sometimes one will end up being placed on top of the other and the one beneath will never be accessible to students and will throw off the quiz entirely as unusable.

A button appears to **Preview** your quiz after the first question has been created. Continue adding questions. When you're finished, select **Done**.

The final video will show markers to indicate where the questions are on the video. These markers cannot be hidden.



#### **Instructions for Students**


When students take the quiz, they must follow the directions below. This section is being added for you to copy and paste as instructions for your students.

### Directions for taking the video quiz




When each question appears, selecting an answer is a 2-step process.


1. Choose your answer to make the **Continue** button appear.



2. Once the answer is selected, the option will have a white outline appear around the box. Choose **Continue** to resume the video.



When you're finished with the video, be sure to click the submit button at the bottom right of the video. You will also have the option to review your answers, but once you press submit, you will have completed the quiz.




## **Making Video Quizzes Appear in the Gradebook**

To view your video quiz in the gradebook, you must add it to an assignment.




Create a Canvas assignment. On the assignment editing page, choose **External Tool** as the Submission Type.




Select **Find** to open a box of choices.




#### Choose Kaltura Video Quiz.



This opens a small screen to Kaltura Media. Select **Embed** on the video quiz you wish to include.



This brings you back to the previous box. Choose **Select** to embed the video on the assignment page
