USF is among the first to be designated as a Florida Collegiate Purple Star Campus, a recognition reserved for institutions that are making a significant commitment to supporting military-connected students and their families.

And this year, the Morsani College of Medicine celebrates its 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. As the newest class of medical school graduates, you can take great pride in knowing that your degree was earned at a world-class institution known for its legacy of excellence, and that you are joining a network of thousands of USF alumni who are making a global impact.
