1. PET4946 - Internship in Physical Education: Elementary	
Core Area – Capstone	Dimensions – CT, INQ, SCP
A full-time internship in the elementary school in which the student undertakes the full range of teaching responsibilities in elementary physical education.	

1. PHC4720 - Foundation of Professional Writing in Public Health	
Core Area – Writing Intensive	Dimensions – CT, INQ, IRD
This course provides students the opportunity to learn professional writing techniques including	

common grammar and spelling errors, writing styles, the ethics of authorship, reference and citation systems, and guidance for scientific communication.
