### The following is additional information for the English major:

- Internships are available and highly recommended for students to incorporate into years three or four of the degree.
- These following courses count as part of your English major **and** your general education:
  - a. LIT 2000 Introduction to Literature (Humanities gen. ed.)
  - b. LIT 3410 Religious and Philosophical Themes (Info & Data Literacy)
  - c. ENG 3674 Film & Culture (Creative Thinking)
  - d. LIT 3353 Literature, Race, & Ethnicity, LIT 3621 Literature of Climate Change, or ENC 3331 Client & Civic Communication (Ethical Reasoning & Civic Engagement)
  - e. CRW 3121 Fiction II or CRW 3321 Poetry II (High Impact Practice).
- This major does require two semesters of foreign language to be completed in a college or university setting.
- If a student is already proficient in a foreign language, they need to discuss testing out of the foreign language with an advisor or the USF World Languages Department.
- There are opportunities for students to apply to be a part of a Student Mentorship program within the English Department.
- There are opportunities for students to submit creative writing pieces into USF journals or outside entities.
- Students must have at least a 2.5 GPA before graduation.
- Students are recommended to continually gain relevant experience for their intended career and/or graduate school path. This might include becoming involved in volunteering or research, completing an internship, or being active on campus with an activity or organization relevant to future goals.
- Students can use electives that are outside of the English department to pursue a minor in a different area of study.
- A minimum of 6 credit hours at the 4000 level are required for both concentrations. (out of the 15 credits of English electives needed, a minimum of 6 credit hours must be at the 4000 level).
- Concentration courses cannot double count as English elective courses.
