Recent events say so much about our university's ability to make ambitious goals a reality. In their respective fall addresses, USF President Rhea Law and Provost Prasant Mohapatra highlighted our goal of becoming a Top 25-ranked public university and maximizing USF's impact across the Tampa Bay region, the State of Florida, and around the world. The university will grow research funding to \$1 billion annually by 2030, which will require our faculty to work in interdisciplinary groups to generate innovation and research outcomes of global significance. An important catalyst for this bold endeavor is the creation of a new college dedicated to the study of artificial intelligence, cybersecurity, and computing. The college will be the first of its kind in Florida and will offer new academic programs and the opportunity for researchers from diverse disciplines to collaborate to explore the opportunities and challenges associated with the growing application of generative artificial intelligence in our daily lives.
