


## Introduction

#### Globull Ambassador Program:



  - over 900 students participated in a faculty led program


## Where we're going

- table cloth



The primary goal for students participating in this committee is developing GloBull Ambassadors signature diversity series events. Five of your 20 hours are dedicated to working within a committee








In partnership with more than 140 countries worldwide, the Fulbright U.S. Student Program offers unparalleled opportunities in all academic disciplines to passionate and accomplished graduating college seniors, graduate students, and young professionals from all backgrounds. Program participants pursue graduate study, conduct research, or teach English abroad.

Fulbright U.S. Student grants may include\*:

- 12 months of <u>non-competitive eligibility (NCE) hiring status</u> within the federal government
- A stipend broadly based on the cost of living in the host country. These funds may be used by the grantee to cover to room, board, and incidental costs during the grant period.
- round-trip transportation to the host country
- pre-departure and/or in-country orientations
- book and research allowances\*
- mid-term enrichment activities
- full or partial tuition
- language study programs

\*dependent on the grant you receive

## Peace Corps Prep

The Peace Corps Prep (PC Prep) program will prepare you for international development fieldwork and potential Peace Corps service. To accomplish this, you'll build four core competencies through interrelated coursework, hands-on experience, and professional development support. These four competencies are the following:

- 1. Training and Experience in a Work Sector
- 2. Foreign Language Skills
- 3. Intercultural Competence and Global Citizenship
- 4. Professional and Leadership Development





### Global Citizens Award

The Global Citizens Award is a program that creates curricular and co-curricular activities for undergraduate students within the framework of the <u>UN Sustainable</u> <u>Development Goals</u>. The aim is to help students engage with global issues, cultivate their cultural awareness, and promote their global competencies.
