JANE CASTOR MAYOR, CITY OF TAMPA

Mayor Jane Castor, the 59th Mayor of the City of Tampa, embodies a legacy of dedicated service and unwavering commitment to her hometown. A lifelong Tampa resident, she graduated Chamberlain High School and the University of Tampa, where she was a basketball and volleyball scholarship recipient and Hall of Famer.

Her journey in public service began as an officer for the Tampa Police Department. She eventually rose through the ranks to become Tampa's first female Chief of Police in 2009. She served six years as chief, pursuing progressive law enforcement strategies, reorganizing the department, and reducing major crimes by 70% citywide.

In 2019, Tampa residents elected her as mayor, and she immediately spearheaded ambitious initiatives through the establishment of the Transforming Tampa's Tomorrow (T3) advisory teams. These teams created roadmaps to address the city's most pressing issues, including transportation, affordable housing, workforce development, resident services, and sustainability and resilience. Overwhelmingly reelected in 2023, Mayor Castor remains resolute in her mission to transform Tampa's tomorrow, placing an emphasis on improving residents' quality of life through the enrichment of city parks and the celebration of art.

You'll often see her around town with beloved "Office Dog" of Tampa City Hall and rescue pup, Alcaldesa, which means mayor in Spanish. Beyond her mayoral duties, Mayor Castor is a proud Seminole Heights resident who enjoys fishing and cheering on Tampa Bay sports teams, from the Stanley-cup-winning Lightning to the Super Bowl-winning Buccaneers. She cherishes quality time with her family, including her partner Ana Cruz and sons, Sergei and Seely, whom she adopted as infants from Ukraine.

Special Remarks



RUFUS DRABBLE BRITISH CONSUL GENERAL IN MIAMI

Rufus Drabble started his role as His Majesty's Consul General in Miami in August 2022. He leads the UK's work promoting economic, commercial, political, security and consular interests in Florida, Puerto Rico and the US Virgin Islands.

Rufus' previous role was in The Netherlands as Regional Director for consular and crisis work across Europe and Central Asia, supporting the

many British travelers and residents in the region. He has also served in Tunisia as Deputy Ambassador, in Singapore in a regional role, and in Afghanistan, Norway and Kenya.

Rufus was involved with recovery efforts in the aftermath of the terrorist attacks in Tunisia (2016) and in Kenya (1998). He has also supported British nationals caught up in the Russian invasion of Ukraine, the collapse of Thomas Cook Airlines, and provided consular help to British football supporters attending the Russia World Cup, after many diplomatic staff were expelled following the Salisbury poisonings.

The British Consulate General in Miami works across Florida, Puerto Rico and the US Virgin Islands to strengthen UK-US relations and to promote British interests.



DAVID LENOX PRESIDENT, BRITISH AMERCAN BUSINESS COUNCIL CENTRAL FLORIDA

David R. Lenox is a partner and one of the founding attorneys of the Orlando office of Greenspoon Marder. Mr. Lenox has also been involved in business valuation disputes and litigation in the State of Florida. In addition, he has been admitted as a solicitor to the Senior Courts of England and Wales and serves as an Arbitrator for the European Center for Dispute Resolution.

As a longtime resident of Central Florida and originally from the UK, Justine heads a multinational marketing firm and consults for leading real estate developers. In addition to the oversight of her businesses, for the past 15 years, she has been a strong advocate for the promotion of trade between the United Kingdom and Central Florida, within the public and private sectors, through her initiatives as a public relations professional.

Some past initiatives include organizing events to promote British-American commercial collaboration, facilitating key introductions for British companies seeking to expand to Florida; serving as Orlando Community Liaison for the 2016 Invictus Games; and hosting a Britweek Orlando series of events that highlighted the rich and diverse creative relationship between the UK and US.

In recognition of ongoing efforts to help foster Central Florida-UK bilateral commercial relationships, Justine was awarded the prestigious honor of Member of the Order of the British Empire (MBE) in Her Majesty The Queen's 2015 New Year's Honours. A commendation bestowed on British nationals who contribute valuable services to the UK and its people in the areas of arts and sciences, public services, or charitable work.

In 2024, Justine was appointed as His Majesty's Honorary Consul of Great Britain and Northern Ireland in Central Florida to help grow the Consulate's commercial reach in the rapidly growing Central Florida corridor. In this voluntary capacity, she supports regional relationship building and champions the UK's Central Florida commercial strategy.

Dr. Addye Buckley-Burnell serves as the Associate Vice President/Executive Director for the Center for Career & Professional Development at the University of South Florida (USF). With nearly 20 years of experience, she has revitalized the Center since November 2022, doubled its size, and formed a dynamic team dedicated to serving USF's 50,000 students and cultivating relationships with employers in the Tampa Bay area, across the US, and around the world.

Additionally, Addye leads USF's Quality Enhancement Plan (QEP), focusing on enhancing students' career readiness through expanded experiential learning opportunities. Sandra Campbell is the Director of the U.S. Commercial Service Tampa Bay, a field office for the International Trade Administration of the U.S. Department of Commerce. Since 1998, Sandra has counseled and developed export strategies for small and medium-sized companies with U.S. products and services throughout the Tampa Bay and Southwest Florida regions. International projects have included Brazil, China,

Germany, Italy, Panama, Poland, and Spain, as well as temporary duty assignments at the U.S. Embassy in Prague, Czech Republic and the U.S. Consulates in Vancouver, Canada and Milan, Italy. In 2016, Sandra did a rotation at the U.S. Department of State's Office of Commercial and Business Affairs (CBA) in the Bureau of Economic and Business Affairs in Washington, D.C. She is also a member of the U.S. Commercial Service's Global Healthcare Technology and Global Education Teams.

Sandra is a cum laude, honors program graduate from the University of South Florida in Tampa, Florida, with Bachelor of Arts degrees in Marketing and International Business, and minor in Italian. She has also attended Oxford Brookes University in Oxford, England and the Università per Stranieri di Perugia in Perugia, Italy. Sandra is a member of the Tampa Bay Area Committee on Foreign Relations and alumna of the FBI Tampa Citizens Academy.



PAUL A. SOHL REAR ADM. USN (RET) CEO, FLORIDA HIGH TECH CORRIDOR

Paul Sohl holds a bachelor's degree in aeronautical engineering from MIT and a master's degree in aeronautical and astronautical engineering from Stanford University. He is the CEO of the Florida High Tech Corridor (The Corridor), which supports a 23-county region anchored by the University of Central Florida (UCF), the University of South Florida (USF), and the University of Florida (UF). As CEO, Sohl facilitates

collaboration between these universities and partners from academia, industry, and economic development. He oversees various programs that promote research, marketing, workforce development, and entrepreneurship. This includes the Matching Grants Research Program, which has generated over \$1 billion in downstream impacts since 1996, and Cenfluence, a tech industry clustering initiative created with support from local governments and Duke Energy.

Sohl assumed his role at The Corridor in June 2020 after a distinguished 30-year career in the U.S. Navy. His last command was leading 500 civilian and military personnel at the Navy's Operational Test & Evaluation Force in Virginia, where he oversaw the testing of all Navy warfighting systems. He also commanded the Naval Aviation Fleet Readiness Center, managing 16,000 personnel and a \$2.9 billion budget, and held leadership positions at the Naval Air Warfare Center in California and the Fleet Readiness Center in Florida. Sohl's experience includes simulation and training as a program director and test pilot, as well as serving overseas in Operations Desert Shield and Enduring Freedom.
