

Apply for your USF ID.

As you prepare your arrival to the University of South Florida, you can already start the process of getting your USF ID card, even before you board your plane to the USA!

So, what benefits will students receive with their USF ID cards?

Just take a look below at all of the resources available to you with a USF ID card:

Free access to public transportation

Your USF ID card will provide you with free access to the USF Bull Runner bus in Tampa, which operates all around campus, and about 1.5 miles (2.4 kilometers) off-campus.

Your USF ID card will also provide you with free access to public transportation in Tampa (Hillsborough Area Regional Transit or 'HART' bus), St. Petersburg (Sun Runner and Looper buses) and Sarasota (Manatee County Area Transit or 'MCAT' and the Breeze buses).

Library access

Your USF ID card will enable you to check out books, laptops, DVDs, and music CDs from the university libraries.

Campus Fitness Centers

Students may use their USF ID cards to gain free access to the campus recreation centers, which offer a wide range of cardiovascular and strength-building resources and programs, including treadmills, swimming pools, free weights and nautilus equipment.

On-Campus Residences and Mail Services

If you are living on-campus, your USF ID card will enable you to swipe into your residence halls as well as your mail rooms.

Other University Services

You may also use your USF ID card when accessing services at the Health and Wellness Center, the Counseling Center, and the Center for Career and Professional Development.

How do students start the process of getting their USF ID Cards?

Follow these three steps to obtain your USF ID Card!

1. Upload a photo (with a light background — see examples) at the **USF ID Card website**.









- 2. When you arrive to USF, simply collect your physical card at the campus ID Card Center where you plan to study. See locations below:
- a. Tampa Campus: Student Services Building 1032
- b. St. Petersburg Campus: Bayboro Hall (BAY) 134
- c. Sarasota Campus: 8350 N. Tamiami Trail in B116
- 3. Remember to activate your card, before using it!

Your initial USF ID card only costs \$10. However, if you lose this card, it will cost \$15 to replace it.



Now that you know all the benefits associated with your USF ID card, be sure to make it a top priority to obtain your ID card in the first week of arriving at the USF campus.






Connecting with People


Off Campus

For example, University Plaza on Fletcher Avenue and the areas around 56th Street and Fowler Avenue offer a mixed variety of options with local favorites like Salem's, Wendy's, Taco Bell, and Pollo Tropical. You'll also find plenty of foreign cuisines offering diverse cultural dishes.

The University Collections Plaza on Fowler Avenue is a melting pot of culinary delights. 
Groceries

The Publix grocery store is right on campus and has everything, including meat, chicken, fresh vegetables and all kinds of tasty snacks. The nearby Walmart store is a one-stop-shop for groceries, clothes, and electronics, and stays open late. Next, the Target store is a lot like Walmart, but fancier. If you are on a tight budget, the Dollar Tree store sells most of its goods for approximately one dollar. ALDI also sells a variety of food as super low prices, but you need to remember to bring a quarter for the shopping cart. For quick snacks and essentials, check out all the other convenient stores near campus like P.O.D Market 7-Eleven, Wawa, and Mobil.

And for personal needs, Bulls Pharmacy on campus provides prescription medications, health products, and daily necessities. The CVS Pharmacy is also nearby, and provides prescriptions, snacks, and toiletries.

Imagine subletting your apartment Facebook for the summer. You are having no luck with finding another student to help you rent out the apartment for the rest of your lease, and you are slowly reaching the point of desperation. You are checking Facebook messenger every day, just to see if ANYONE took interest in your apartment, so you can finally go home for summer. You finally open the Facebook app one day to find that one person is totally interested! As the days go on, you find out that this student has expressed that they need you to help them out with a couple security fees, because they are currently struggling to pay for them right now. So, you, being the kindhearted person that you are with a couple extra bucks to spare, end up sending them \$100.

As time goes by, they are now continuously asking you for more money, making up lie- afterlie to try to get you to send them more funds through an online transfer. They have shown you screenshots of the completed application form and have asked you to help them out with the last half of the sublease fee. What could go wrong? They have already shown you the completion of the sublease form ...right?

Little did you know that this tactic is a common con used by scammers to defraud students out of hundreds of dollars. I know this, because I was that person who tried helping out a so-called fellow "student" who in fact was not a student at all, and only had an interest in swindling me out of a couple hundred dollars.

There are other stories of students who have been cornered in the MSC (Marshall Student Center) by scammers wearing a USF tee-shirt or polo jersey, claiming to be affiliated with the University of South Florida, and requesting or event demanding money from unsuspecting new students.

But I'm going to let you in on a little secret: if someone you don't know asks you to take money out of your savings and hand them cash to cover a student debt or any other fee, THEY DO NOT WORK FOR USF!

So how can we fix this problem, and educate all students of possible student scam attempts whether it be through online or personal interactions? The first step is to become immediately suspicious of anyone asking you to take out a couple hundred dollars out of a bank machine to settle a "student

debt" or "the remaining balance of your financial aid". Unfortunately, even if a person is wearing USF attire, it does not mean that they are employed by the University or have the right to tell you to do this.

How to interact with an in-person scammer:

The best strategy of dealing with an in-person scammer is to not interact with them at all. You should walk away and report them to a university staff member working behind a desk, within an office, or who is a uniformed law enforcement officer.

Usually, when students try to converse with scammers, they forget that scammers are almost like professional liars. Remember, these people are very good at their trade and will say anything and everything to get money or personal information from you.

Similar to in-person scammers, there are also digital scammers who will try to steal your money. Here are some tips to protect you from these types of online scammers:

Tip #1: If someone is texting you through any sort of social media app asking for money (Facebook, Instagram, Snapchat), they are likely a scammer. No matter what type of evidence they try to show to convince you that they are legitimate, they are most likely lying and trying to steal from you.

Tip #2: If you receive an email from an email address that is not from the University (an address ending in usf.edu) asking you to transfer money to a phone number or an email address, it is best to block the email address from your email account to ensure that you are staying scamfree.

Final Thoughts: So, how can you tell if you actually owe money to the university, or to your off-campus apartment? The best way to find out if you have a balance is to go directly to those offices, whether it be financial aid, admissions, or housing. Calling the phone numbers listed on their official website is another good way to ensure that you are speaking with a legitimate person, and this includes off-campus apartment buildings.

"How can you tell if you actually owe money...?"

Scammers lurk online or in-person to find anyone who will be willing to give them money willingly and will tell you convincing lies to persuade you that they are legitimate. To avoid the personal and financial pain of being scammed, you must remember to 1) hang up, ignore or walk away from suspicious people demanding personal or personal information, avoid clicking on suspicious links (phishing) trying to steal your information, and 2) report these scammers to a person in authority that you trust. Stay safe and alert because your money and personal information depend on it!
