Update From the Vice President



USF World is thrilled to announce that your generosity has allowed us to endow the <u>Education</u> <u>Abroad Scholarship Fund</u>. Endowment means that your donations will generate funds annually that can be used to aid students seeking experiences around the world. From research to internships to academic study, this is the time of year when students confirm their plans for study abroad programs during the summer months. More than 200 students have already taken advantage of the Bulls Abroad scholarship opportunity with more scholarship announcements on the way. President Law has been a vocal advocate for study abroad as a means for students to enhance their academic careers at USF and hone the skills necessary

to succeed in our global economy. Traveling and studying in a country and culture different from one's own contributes to improvement in communication skills, confidence building, self-awareness and problem-solving.

Just as we encourage students to seek learning opportunities abroad, we are committed to hosting a series of globally focused events across our campuses - events that bring together students and faculty with community, policy, and business leaders. January brought us an amazing opportunity to hear from distinguished U.S. diplomat Barbara Stephenson, a former ambassador and now Vice Provost for Global Affairs and Chief Global Officer at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. Ambassador Stephenson spent a day meeting with our students and answering their questions about careers in the diplomatic arena. In an evening conversation open to the public and hosted by USF World and the Global and National Security Institute former Ambassador Barbara Stephenson and U.S. Marine General (Ret) Frank McKenzie, Jr. discussed current global security and diplomatic challenges and opportunities, from the military and economic threats posed by China, the Russian invasion of Ukraine, the conflict between Israel and Hamas, and the importance of alliances to successful global strategy.
